In this course, we outline the grant submission process from locating and selecting funding opportunities, to preparing competitive proposal narratives. We will begin with a basic introduction of grant funding, and how to locate grant opportunities that fit with your research objectives and interests.

- **Identify funding sources for your research projects**
- **Complete and submit a grant narrative and/or application**
- **Polish your grant and proposal writing skills**
- **Credit towards research/writing hours or audit class**

After each student has selected a grant opportunity, we will move through the narrative, section-by-section, to discuss basic tools and techniques for writing effective research proposals. Finally, we will review some of the logistical aspects of grant or fellowship proposals including: budgets, budget justifications, data management plans and other supporting documentation.
